Dolphin Square is a block of private flats with some ground floor business units near the River Thames in Pimlico, Westminster, built between 1935 and 1937. Until the building of Highbury Square, it was the most developed garden square in London built as private housing.

In the heart of the Pimlico Conservation Area, the Restoration Programme is underway to assess every aspect of Dolphin Square to meet the demands and expectation of London living in the 21st Century from the use of space and energy to the care of our biodiverse environment.
